
Each part is notated within the student's reading range on a separate page to facilitate ease in reading. Combined scores for the teacher are located on pages 58–72.


The ensembles provide excellent motivational material for group lessons, recitals and monster concerts. Enjoy!

A General MIDI disk is available (8597), which includes a full piano recording and background accompaniment.













