- F major has a key signature of one flat $B b$. All the Bs in a piece in $F$ major will be flat, unless cancelled by a natural ( $(4)$.
- A dot after a note makes the note half as long again. A dotted crotchet/quarter note (.) has the same duration as ...
- A canon is another word for a 'round'.
- mp (mezzo-piano) means 'medium soft'.
